1. What makes your university unique?

Bentley is first and foremost a business university that blends a core in business with liberal arts. Bentley's General Business (GB) core is the defining element of a Bentley education. It consists of 9 core classes in accounting, finance, management, marketing, and operations. All students take the GB core regardless of their major to familiarize them with all aspects of business and to prepare them for success in their career.

Yes, if English is not the student's native language. We require a minimum TOEFL of 90 (no subscore below 20) and IELTS of 7 (no subscore below 7).

4. What is your average/minimum GPA?

3.7 average.

5. What is the minimum AP classes required?

No minimum, but we rate the student's rigor of curriculum as lower if no AP's are taken.

6. Do you give university credit for AP classes, SAT scores, CLEP scores, etc?

We award credit for AP scores of 4 or higher in most subjects other than AP Computer Science, AP English, AP Seminar, and AP Research.

Yes, we award merit-based scholarships that range from \$15,000 to full-tuition. No separate application is required; when an application is reviewed for admission we also review for merit scholarship potential. The basis of the award is the strength of the student's academic profile. We do not award financial aid or need-based scholarships to international students.
